Frequently Asked Questions

Once I am qualified to apply, how do I improve my chances of getting accepted?

- Complete as many Science Option and Support courses before you apply, with a grade of 'C' or higher. The more you have complete, the more consideration you will receive.
- Complete the WSU Math Quantitative Literacy (1030, 1040, or 1050) requirement. 85% of accepted students have completed this requirement. The other 15% are usually finishing the requirement when they apply.
- Obtain any volunteer or paid health care experience, and be able to provide proof of experience in your application.
- Complete an AS or AA degree from any Utah System of Higher Education (USHE) institution, or a BS or BA degree from any regionally-accredited institution.
- Although first-time applicants may be accepted into the program, additional consideration will be given to previously qualified applicants.

How do my credits transfer from other institutions?

You may visit our online transfer guide at *weber.edu/transferguide* for a list of courses from other regionally-accredited colleges/universities and show how those courses transfer to Weber State University.

I am just starting, what courses should I register for?

placed into Math 1010 or QL
010 or Math QL (1030, 1040, or 1050)
1010 – Intro to College Writing
110 – Biomedical Core; or Zool 2100 – Anatomy
1020 or 2110; or Psych 1010 – Intro to Psych

Is there a time limit to how old my courses can be?

There is no expiration for prerequisite courses. However, if students stop at Math 1010 and do not fulfill Math Quantitative Literacy (QL), Math 1010 expires after one year. Once a student completes the Math QL requirement, there is no expiration.

Math QL is the state requirement for math. To fulfill Math QL, students need to complete either Math 1030, 1040 or 1050 with a grade of 'C' or higher.

Do I need letters of recommendation?

No. The department does not ask for letters of recommendation. The application consists of a fee, official or unofficial transcripts from all colleges and universities (including WSU), a personal statement, and documentation of any health care-related experience. If students complete the CNA in place of REST 1560, a copy of the certificate needs to be attached.

What should I expect once I'm accepted into the program?

You will have lab and class three times a week and clinical hours twice a week at your assigned facility. Clinical sites are assigned to you by the department and range from Logan to South Salt Lake for the Ogden and Davis programs, and clinicals for the Provo program are held at Utah Valley Regional Medical Center. The length of the program varies by location.
