## What is HOBY?

An annual three day leadership conference for sophomores from high schools throughout the state. Our focus is to help students learn personal, group, and society leadership skills that can be utilized toward their endeavor to be an influence for good in their community.

Hugh O'Brian was inspired to create the seminar when he spent nine days with Nobel Peace Prize winner, Dr. Albert Schweitzer in Africa. Schweitzer felt that "the most important thing in education is to teach young people to think for themselves."

## Student Outcomes

15 and 16 year olds are at an important stage of life. Experiences they are having at these ages contribute to their self discovery. Students that capture the spirit of HOBY go home believing that they are unstoppable. They have heard from entrepreneurs, volunteers, representatives from universities and colleges, leaders from various religious and political groups, being able to ask them questions and receive individual answers. Where else can sophomores have that type of one-on-one time with that wide range of specialists? It really can be a life changing experience for them. HOBY alumni have created successful non-profit organizations that aide men, women, and children worldwide.

## Looking Forward

We had 139 student ambassadors attend the 2012 seminar compared to the 99 in 2011. With this growth, more students may catch glimpses of their potential as influences for good. As motivation to get involved in the community, ambassadors may apply for service-based HOBY scholarships. In 2012, 30 scholarships totaling over \$251,000 were offered from nine difference universities and colleges throughout the state. Since its inception, the HOBY Utah Scholarship program has awarded over \$1.5 million to our outstanding alumni!

## My Role At HOBY

I was an ambassador at the 2004 seminar and I've been involved ever since. I've been a junior facilitator, staff, group facilitator and director of programs in the past nine years. I am currently fulfilling the responsibilities for Leadership Seminar Chair. I have met amazing people from whom I've learned a lot.
