"Northern Utah has one of the highest rates of LGBT suicide and homelessness, and Jackson is committed to ensuring that today's LGBT teens have what they need to thrive. He is an amazing mentor to youth. He tells us that his time at 'The Biggest Loser' ranch has been one of his biggest challenges, and we are thrilled to cheer him on."

A viewing party for the first night of the two-part premiere will also be held Jan. 6 from 7 to 9 p.m. at the Marriott-Slaterville City Offices.

"It's kind of surreal to see my brother on 'The Biggest Loser' promos," Alexander said. "Our family is proud and happy and can't wait to cheer him on and see where this opportunity leads."
