CPPM Changes:

Course level for new Gen Ed courses – 3000-level courses in GE - For now, GEIAC has "grandfathered" the
existing 5 upper division courses in GE for further consideration at the meeting on 11/29. Specific data is being
gathered on who is taking these upper division GE courses and if students are using them for GE or for other
degree requirements. GEIAC voted on the following policy:

"Any new or existing courses requesting GE designation must be a 1000 or 2000 level course." Motion was approved by GEIAC with 1 nay and 1 abstention. and unanimously approved by UCC.

- Curriculum will be voting on the new GEIAC motions for:
 - no upper division courses having Gen Ed designation
 - no prerequisites on Gen Ed courses except QL and COMP.
 - Will present motions to Faculty Senate when all GEIAC proposed CPPM changes are ready

There was a big difference between this conference and other AAC&U STEM conferences in the last six years. Data that has become available regarding program restructuring in the last 2-10 years is the reason for this difference. It shows that program restructuring has made student success rate increased significantly. It was noted that students are taking more classes, more successfully and are graduating sooner with better outcomes. Many institutions are showing that engaged learning initiatives and a team approach across colleges are successful at other universities, we can look for similar results as we move forward. A TLF subcommittee is looking at these approaches, this overlaps with a Faculty Senate ad hoc committee that is also looking at them.

- 3. Updates Doris Geide-Stevenson
 - TLF Announcement December 20 deadline. Would like uneven number committee for interviewing.
 - Gail Niklason would be a good Ex-Officio member of TLA, she is very engaged in what is happening, this would bring her additional ability to effect the committee. Will vote on this at Faculty Senate.
 - Ombuds Position No applications have been received. Doris is approaching individuals, others please do also.
 - EAST Replacement of Fred Chiou Hugo Valle received 2nd highest vote within EAST, if he declines then offer to the one that received 3rd and then 4th highest votes. The college will replace Fred on Senate.
 - GSBE Eric Smith no longer able to be on UCC, recommend Wendy Fox-Kirk as replacement. Will vote in Faculty Senate
 - USHE Faculty Senate Chairs meeting The structure that other universities are using for their Faculty Senate leadership is chair elect, chair, past chair. This could be a good model for WSU which addresses the issues that come with chair transitions. Consider if we have the right structure to assure that transitions are good. If we were to implement this it would require a bylaw change. Regarding faculty support via reassigned time UVU reported they have 2/3 of faculty that have reassigned time, Doris will be following up to get confirmation of this.
 - Mandatory training on affirmative action and equal opportunity hiring will be given this spring
 - PPM 4-19 grading practice went back to athletics. Madonne checked with them it was fine and has been
 passed on.
 - Autobiographical form status currently use existing form. APAFT is working on revising the form.

 - EIC/SPARC proposed bylaw changes PPM 1-13, B-V-4.6 Reading did not seem to bring issues
 - Executive Committee election bylaw change <u>PPM 1-13</u>, B-II-7 No anticipated issues
 - <u>PPM 1-18</u> Duties of Department Chairs update Will recirculate to Department Chair group with edits that Executive Committee recommended. Will present at Faculty Senate in December.
