- 3. Administrative Update President Wight Presidential transition. The Regents will appoint an interim president May 1, 2018. President Wight will be around some to help with the transition from May 1-June 30. A search committee will be comprised of representatives from the Board of Regents, trustees and institutional stakeholders including faculty, staff, students, administration, alumni and community members. The presidential search committee will hold public meetings this spring to obtain input from the Weber State community and the public on the presidential search. It is intended for a new president to come into office about January 1, 2019.
- 4. Administrative Update Provost Miner. The Vice Presidents want to continue the course that President Wight has set as we move through the transition.
- 5. <u>Department of Radiologic Sciences</u> name change Provost Miner. The name change is from department to school. Schools seem to be entities that have larger groupings under them than departments, but not large enough to be Colleges. Currently the university does not have clear naming criteria. Radiological Sciences has graduated the second largest number of students at Weber State University in the last 5 years.
- 6. <u>Faculty Inversion Update</u>, SBBFP Kristin Hadley. Only departments with inversions are listed in the presentation. No justifying reasons were factored into the data. The salary committee will make a request to the Provost to consider specific inversions. Data on specific faculty is available for Deans and Provost to address salary inversion issues.

DISCUSSION: There are Psychology classes that are very similar and are upper division. The psychology department would like instructors to advertise these courses for additional depth after this class. Class overlaps with HLTH 3400 and other Ed classes. Health Promotion is supportive of the course but wants to note that there is overlap. It was noted that this is 2000 level and will not be as in depth as 3000 level classes offered.

9. Awarding of Degrees PPM 4-1.G & 4-1.V – Mark Denniston, ASSA Chair

PPM 4-1.G is a clarification that a student may not earn a second bachelor's degree in the same major. Some redundancy in the policy was removed.
