

Each Physical Therapy School is unique and have their very own requirements. This checklist reviews common admissions, selection, and prerequisites, but may not cover all requirements for every school. It is the student's responsibility to contact multiple schools, see what each of them require, and then work backwards to create *their own academic plan*.

✓ Common Admissions and Selection Process

____ Is your college/university overall cumulative GPA at least **3.0?** *Most require 3.0 and higher.

*To be competitive you will want your GPA to be 3.4 and higher.

____ Interviews

*To develop your interview skills, resume writing, and help with using Handshake and LinkedIn, see Career Services. weber.edu/<u>CareerServices</u>

____ Written Essays

*Look up examples online from students who have been accepted and visit the Writing Center. weber.edu/WritingCenter

____ Observation/Patient Hours (100+ hours minimum, more is better.)

*Try to acquire patient hours in different settings (i.e. outpatient, inpatient, home health, clinic, hospital, rehabilitation, sports facilities, etc.)

_____ 3-4 Letters of Recommendations or Letters of Reference

_____ Most programs require specific scores on the Graduate Record Examinations (GREs).

*GRE scores are used by most PT schools admissions committee. From data collected, we can easily deduce that a 155+ Verbal, 155+ Quantitative, and a 4.0+ on the essay writing is generally considered a competitive score for Physical therapy (PT) programs.

_____ They require courses with letter grades will be evaluated, majority of AP Scores will not be accepted.

_____ Many programs require the science classes be current within 5-7 years.

The Physical Therapist Centralized Application Service (PTCAS) is a service of the American Physical Therapy Association (APTA). PTCAS allows applicants to use a single application and one set of materials to apply to multiple DPT programs. Some PT programs only accept anatomy and/or physiology courses completed in a biology, neuroscience, anatomy/physiology or integrated department. PT programs may not accept a combined anatomy and physiology (A&P) course or those completed in other departments, such as kinesiology. Be aware that some schools require Biology classes but they will not take Zoology classes. The U of U will accept the Health Sciences or Zoology series. Research more schools to learn of their requirements.
