Snow College and Weber State University mutually agree that students successfully completing the Snow College Respiratory Therapy AAS degree and who successfully obtain the RRT Certification will be able to transfer to Weber State University to complete the program leading to a Bachelor of Science in Respiratory Therapy.

APPLY FOR ADMISSION TO WEBER STATE

- Submit an application for admission to Weber State University and pay the application fee.
- Provide official transcripts from all previously attended institutions of higher education.
- Meet departmental requirements for program acceptance.
- Declare Respiratory Therapy as the program of study upon admission.

APPLY FOR PROGRAM ACCEPTANCE

- Successfully complete the Respiratory Therapy AAS degree at Snow College.
- Hold a current American Heart Association (AHA) Basic Life Support (BLS) Healthcare Provider OR American Red Cross Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) for Healthcare Providers certification card.
- Maintain membership with the American Association for Respiratory Care (AARC) (student membership accepted).
- Achieve a minimum GPA of 2.75.
- Hold a current National Board for Respiratory Care (NBRC) RRT credential.
- Complete the Weber State University admissions application and be accepted.
- Complete the Weber State Respiratory Therapy Online application and be accepted.
- Students meeting these requirements will be admitted into the BS continuing program.

UPON TRANSFER TO WEBER STATE UNIVERSITY

- All Snow College coursework will be accepted as transfer credit based on current course evaluations. Some
 courses may transfer as electives. All will be based on the current transfer guide.
- Students will meet with a Weber State College of Health Professions Admissions and Advising advisor to determine remaining general education and upper-division courses needed to fulfill BS degree requirements.
- Snow College courses may satisfy some of Weber State University's general education requirements. (If the student has an AS degree in addition to the AAS degree, all general education requirements will be met.)
- A total of 120 semester credit hours is required for the BS degree. Many of these credits will be met through transfer, credit by testing, and required courses (see below).
- Students must complete the residency requirement of 30 Weber State credits (credit by examination does NOT count toward the 30-credit residency requirement).
- Weber State requires a total of 40 upper-division semester credits for the BS degree

Additional credits required to fulfill Weber State University BS requirements will include:

Required:

- REST 3800 Respiratory Care Certifications (or equivalent: ACLS, PALS, and NRP) (3 credits)
- **REST 4610** Advanced Patient Assessment (1-2 credits)
- **REST 4620** Health Promotion (1-2 credits)
- **REST 4630** Continuous Quality Improvement (1-2 credits) OR **HIM 3300** Introduction to Quality Improvement in Healthcare (3 credits)
- The remaining Respiratory Therapy BS requirements at Weber State University can be met by submitting an Application for Credit Special Examination form, where students apply for specific course credits and pay associated fees. The RRT credential fulfills the majority of the Respiratory Therapy BS course requirements except for those listed above. Students must apply for credit and pay the associated fees to receive credit for these requirements. It is advised to meet with the department advisor to begin this process.
